

SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT

If the **subject** is singular, you use a singular verb



The **dog** jumps over the fence.

He dances very well.



Mary is going to the library this afternoon.

If the **subject** is plural, you use a plural verb

The **dogs** jump over the fence.



They dance very well.

Mary and her friends are going to the library this afternoon.



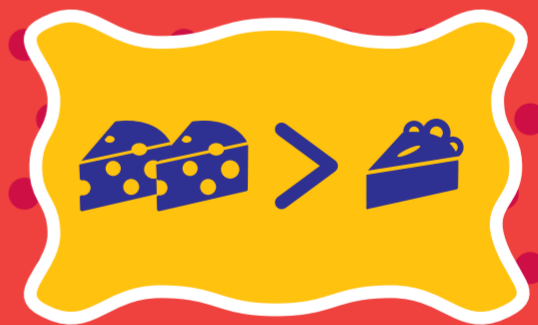
Don't forget who/what and where your **subject** is.
